Secretary's Report for year 2011

Team reports

Teams - Senior

David Clancy was initially ratified as senior manger in February 2011 for the year. In June Mick Stynes agreed to take over as Senior Team manager for the reminder of the season. The Club would like to thank John Moore, Christopher Brennan and David Clancy for their work in the early part of the season. Ollie Brannock and Paul Sinnot who were also selectors with David Clancy continued to work with Mick Stynes for the remainder of the season.

Seniors - Aldridge Cup

The Aldridge Cup was our first official competition and while we did not progress beyond the group stage, and with little training, we did manage to show some good early form.

Senior League Division 2

The seniors played in division 2 and the team started positively with good win over Moorefield however the team suffered a lot of injuries and failure of the county board to release county players hampered our progress midway through the league which resulted in us missing a chance of promotion. We retained our status in Division 2 and next year the first target of the Senior team will be to win Division 2.

Championship

We were drawn against Ballymore in the first round and to be fair Ballymore were far the better prepared team and we suffered a disappointing loss.

Due to the Kildare Senior team progress in the All Ireland qualifiers the club championship was put on hold. This worked to our advantage and gave the players time to prepare for the second round against Athy. This game was a real championship game and a much improved Suncroft side battled very hard and had Athy down to the wire however a last minute penalty from Athy gave them a 6 point cushion in the end. Apart from the disappointment of suffering a loss we also suffered another injury blow to John Brown.

The next game we had was against Clane and this turned out to be a real battle and Suncroft to their credit never gave up however we narrowly lost out in the end. This result meant Suncroft needed to win their next game against Kilcock to try and avoid a regulation battle. In fairness to the players they approached the Kilcock game with great heart and played some great football and were rewarded with victory over Kilcock. Dispute this great victory Suncroft had to play in the regulation playoff and once again the draw gave us Kilcock. Suncroft played Kilcock again won the game and secured senior status for the club. The fact that Suncroft beat the same team twice in the championship is an excellent achievement and one that both the Club and its supporters really appreciate.
